CARE Project, under UC Berkeley's Asian American Research Center, is a federal grant-funded oral history project with two community organizations in San Francisco who serve Filipino and Southeast Asian American elders. We are looking for Community Interviewers to learn how to conduct oral history interviews with elders at Bayanihan Equity Center and Lao Seri Association about their lives during the COVID-19 pandemic. You will be trained on how to conduct the interviews, and you will be matched with approximately 2 elders to interview. You will be paid **\$25 per hour** for the training and the interviews via gift cards.
